- 1. The meeting was called to order at 3:00 pm by Chairman Darrin Moody and introductions were made around the room.
- 2. Sheriff Salisbury moved to approve the minutes of the February Governance Board meeting as presented. Commissioner Shutty seconded the motion which carried.

3. Director's Report:

- a. District 13 Radio Issues Issues continue to be a problem, which MACECOM has been working with Day Wireless to put up a temporary input/output. Day Wireless is working with PUD 3 on the connectivity and have all the parts. When up and running we'll be testing again.
- b. Strategic Planning Process Chief Bakken is back and available so they will be setting a date for the next fire stake holders meeting.
- c. Personnel MACECOM had two dispatcher positions to fill. One position was filled this month with a past MACECOM dispatcher who had been hired on in January as temporary full-time. MACECOM is now looking to fill one more dispatcher position. Social media was highly successful in getting the word out and MACECOM received 117 applications. The process of testing has started and planning on roughly 40 going into the final assessment center. Testing will be April 7th.
- 4. Pro-Phoenix The committee met and unanimously chose Pro-Phoenix. The interfaces with Spillman have been contacted and entered in the contract. The packet includes an insert with the anticipated software, hardware, training, and annual maintenance costs. It also included a breakout cost for all fire and law enforcement agencies. There is anticipated savings over the next coming years and a much better program. Chief McKern moved to send the recommendation to purchase Pro-Phoenix on to the Legislative Board. Commissioner Shutty seconded. Motion passed.
- 5. Vehicle: Sheriff Salisbury moved to send the proposal to purchase the vehicle that has been discussed on to the Legislative Board. Chief McKern seconded. Motion passed.
